HAITI MARCH 2012 REPORT

It is so difficult to put in words especially in this amount of space all the great ministry that happens on these trips. The team painted the third floor, repaired a leaking roof, provided medical care at the school and the tent city in the Ravine, distributed the Peanut Butter balls in the Ravine, loved on many children

and adults, built and installed a screen door on the school kitchen, played basketball and soccer with the children and a community food distribution.

One of my highlights was watching Camden Clark and the young man (Marc) he and his family sponsor, bond over the course of the week. They became

great friends who impacted each other and myself as I watched these two young men grow to respect and love each other. We had a very young team that was a concern going in but after working with and watching how everyone of these members carried themselves it truly was a blessing to work with all.

COMMUNITY FOOD DISTRIBUTION

The community food distribution was in Dessources a small community outside of Port Au Prince at El Shaddai Children's Home and Christian School headed by Marie Prinvil. Marie arranged to pick up rice, spaghetti noodles and cooking oil to distribute in the two villages near her orphanage. The team spent several hours packing gallon sized bags with rice, a package of noo-

dles and cooking oil in a Bilo grocery bag. Which we handed out to over 260 families. Marie explained to us many of these families had not eaten for several days or weeks in some cases. This was a time of heartfelt thanks from many we had the opportunity to share the food with that our team purchased for this project. I know for many of us this was one of the highlights of the

trip. It also was a stark reminder that people are not eating everyday. It was also disturbing to know that we had the funds available to purchase rice and beans but the beans were not readily available even with the funds to purchase. We come from the land of plenty and even with funds could not purchase a much needed staple for a source of protein while in Haiti.
