CHRISTMAS IN ECUADOR

The time is finally here! We have been preparing for Christmas in Ecuador for several months now, and it is finally time to send our contributions to Tony Geouge for Christmas in Benemerita Sociedad de Protectora del la Infancia.

36 girls and 23 boys are being housed in this orphanage, and without our contribution their Christmas celebration will not exist. Project James' goal is to send a \$30 gift for each child. This money will be used to pur-

chase clothing and other necessities for each of the children, as well as to purchase toys, and cymbals for the shared drum set in the orphanage.

In addition to these gifts, the \$30 donation will provide a day at the waterpark for each of the children, so that they can celebrate Christmas both in their "home" and as they go out together.

Through all of these provisions, \$30 will cover a lot, but, most importantly, as the children cele-

brate the season of God's original coming, they will be exposed to the fact that His coming changed His people. They will "understand, as all God's people should, how wide, how long, how high, and how deep His love is", as your gifts remind them that they are cherished, both by our Father, and by His children who are sharing His heart.

Every Christmas I ask for increased understanding of some part of God's story; for a revelation that will make the season come alive for me, and rebuke the cliché spirit that can take over the celebration.

This year, I am struck by "Emmanuel". **God with us**. Christmastime is invading my everyday through the constant unwrapping of what this truth really means. We teach that God has always been, and that He will one day be (in a way that we can

see and wholly embrace who He is), but do we teach—and understand—that **He is now**? During this time of year, it is easy to embrace that God WAS with us, and most people believe that God WILL BE with us, when this world fades and we enter what is to come. But do we embrace that He IS with us?

My question for myself this season is this: Do I understand Emmanuel? Do I understand what His presence means between
